This year we had 4 students either accepted into medicine or dentistry with another heading into the field of nuclear medicine.

Given the events over the weekend, I would like to express my heartfelt appreciation for the work that was undertaken, caused by TC Kirrily and the Heatwave. My thanks to all staff and students for the exceptional preparations and the clean-up work that followed the storm. Your dedication and commitment to maintaining our college is truly commendable.

Every year we are blessed to support some incredible young people who lead our students from Kindergarten to Year 12. On Tuesday night I was fortunate enough to observe our Year 6 – Year 12 leaders work together to develop their skills. The Admin. team have already received some interesting ideas for approval and feedback which is indicative of the enthusiasm and organisational skills of very a talented student executive team. I am equally impressed by the Year 12 cohort and similarly look forward to the leadership these seniors will provide collectively to the College student body.

Reflection Room

Throughout 2023 and continuing into this year the College has been reviewing our Student Code of Conduct. In January we had Janet Thompson from Classroom Profiling Association come to the College to present a professional development on the Essential Skills to Classroom Management, which has been a great way to start the year as we prepared for the students' return. This term we will be trialing a new system called the 'Reflection Room'. This will not simply be a detention room for minor behaviours, and more details will be communicated to our students and parents over the coming weeks about how this consequence will be used to support our students and teachers in maintaining a safe learning environment.


