

Assessment Policy

It's that time when it may be prudent to give some important reminders about rules and processes around assessment. Many students will find that they have a number of assessments due in the upcoming weeks. So, it's a good time for students and parents to familiarise themselves with our Junior Secondary (Years 7-10) and Senior Secondary Assessment Policies (Year 11 & 12) which can be found on the College's Webpage by clicking on the "Education" tab at the top and selecting "Assessment" from the drop down list. Students and parents should take particular note of the rules and processes around 'illness and misadventure' and submission of late assessments. A summary of this is also contained on Page 9 of the Student Diary.

Be Careful Planning Holidays

Did you know that for senior assessment the Queensland Curriculum & Assessment Authority (QCAA) has very clear rules for senior studies regarding missing assessment due to family holidays etc. Their regulations state:

"In Years 11 & 12 students are NOT eligible for extensions to due dates if there is a known reason for an absence that is a matter of the student's or parent's/carer's own choosing (e.g. family holidays), and the student will be absent on the day the assessment is due." This particularly affects senior exams, where we are simply not allowed under the QCAA's academic integrity rules to reschedule exams for individual

students because of holidays taken during term time.

NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM Literacy and Numeracy

Why do students do NAPLAN?

NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake.

As students progress through their school years, it's important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy. NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national standards and over time.

All schools will be completing 2024 NAPLAN Online from 13-22 March.

Your child will do the NAPLAN tests online

Schools have transitioned from paper-based to computer-based assessments. All Year 3 students will continue to complete the writing assessment on paper.

Participation in NAPLAN

NAPLAN is for everyone. ACARA supports inclusive testing so all students have the opportunity to participate in the national assessment program. Adjustments are available for students with disability who have diverse functional abilities and needs. Please contact Bridget Price bprice@acc.qld.edu.au to discuss adjustments.


