

When I visited a Year 12 class this week, I had an opportunity to watch a student presentation. Whilst I was impressed with the quality of the content and the poignant digital presentation that the student had prepared, the fun, and support from peers and the teacher that permeated the interactions in that class made it a memorable experience.

On reflection, that class provided an experience of our vision to be a College that celebrates life and learning through Christ-centred Education. In his book, The Air We Breathe, Glen Scrivener raises awareness of the radical, lasting, pervasive change Jesus' teaching and interactions had on Western culture's views on equality, compassion, freedom, service, and kindness. Christ-centred education focusses our attention on how God sees us and raises awareness for each student of their unique God given purpose. This awareness informs our responsibilities, differentiation and diverse aspirations.

When Jesus was asked "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?' Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: "Love your neighbour as yourself" – Matthew 22: 36 – 39 (NIV). The Bible teaches us that "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres" – 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 (NIV).

At ACC, we aim to build a safe, supportive, and Christ-centred community. To ensure that we set each other up to feel safe and supported in our community, everyone has the following responsibilities:

- To let others feel safe and supported online as well as in physical settings.
- When students feel upset, they should report rather than react.
- Courage is the ability to engage with a task when someone feels uncertain, anxious, and out of their comfort zone.

Parent Teacher Interviews

Our Parent Teacher Interviews are scheduled for next week and will be an opportunity to discuss your child's progress and report card. If you did not get an opportunity to book an interview, please contact your child's classroom teacher.

Year 1 to 6

The interviews for students in Years 1 to 6 will be located in the Hall. They will be 10mins long across 2 days: Tuesday 29th July and Thursday 31st July from 3:20-5:30pm.

Prep

The Prep interviews will take place in the Prep classrooms. They will be 15 minutes long over 3 days: Tuesday 29th July, Wednesday 30th July and Thursday 31st July from 3:15-5:30pm.

Year 5 Camp

Our Year 5s have just returned from their camp to Virginia Park Station, a working cattle station 80 kms west of Townsville, and Charters Towers, as part of the Year 5 studies of early outback life in Australia. Students were taught how to pan for gold, explored the significance of Charters Towers in the Gold Rush era, and experienced cattle property life including cow milking, horse riding, bonfires and camp cooking. This camp is always a highlight for our students.

Year 6 Canberra Tour – Term 3 Week 5

Our Year 6 students will be going on a tour to Canberra. They will be undertaking an education tour of the national capital where the students will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. It is a seven day / six night camp from 10th August to 16th August.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education.

To assist families in meeting the costs of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$750 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) program towards those costs.

Interhouse Cross Country

The Primary Interhouse Cross-Country will be held in week 7 – Friday 29th August. All students will be running official distances within the College grounds and surrounding community. More details and the timetable will be sent to parents closer to the event.

Swimming Lessons

Primary students in Years 1 to 6 will do a 4-day intensive of swimming lessons during Week 7 and 8 of this term. Lessons will be conducted at Love2Swim, Long Tan Pool in Heatley. Our students in Years 1 and 2 will have 30min lessons and our students in Years 3 to 6 will have 45min lessons. Students will be assessed at the first lesson to be placed into the appropriate group for the remainder of the week. Transport to and from the swim centre each day will be via a local bus company. There are no additional costs for the swimming lessons or the coach transport.

Book Week

Week 6 is Book Week, which means we will once again have book characters wandering our school! If you don't want to do last minute sewing, can I encourage you to have a chat to your child about who they want to go as for Book Character Day.

Cyber Safety Update: Live Video Chats & Use of Webcams

Live Video Chat and use of Webcams is currently popular with young people. These apps can have positive outcomes, but there are also some serious potential dangers that need to be considered. For example, Omegle (re-launched as Uhmegle) was shut down due to being connected with grooming activities by paedophiles. Towards the end of last term, we discovered that some of our students have been using this app not just at home, but at school as well. Fortunately our IT Team detected this and we were able to act swiftly. The use of such apps at school without explicit permission from a staff member is a breach of our ICT Policy.

At our last assembly I spoke at length about the use of video chats and protective measures that students can employ if engaging in the use if such apps. When engaged in online chatting activity at home it is still important to consider safety. This can be addressed by:

- Considering who you are chatting to and what you are sharing with them.
- Remembering that what you share on camera (including things in the background) can give away personal information.
- Realising that webcam or live video footage can also be recorded by someone and then potentially shared and uploaded anywhere online.

- Have you set yourself goals to strive for during this year?
- 2. Do you know what motivates you to learn and complete your work for school?
- 3. Do you try to take a positive approach to school and your studies?
- 4. Do you make the most of class time, listening and focusing and completing all work?
- 5. Have you been asking for help if you don't understand something?
- 6. Have you been writing all your homework into your diary or online planner and getting it done?
- 7. Have you been breaking down bigger tasks and scheduling the work in your diary/planner?
- 8. Have you been keeping track of what you complete and rescheduling unfinished work?
- 9. Have you organised your folders for papers and digital resources for school?
- 10. Do you have folders or somewhere at home to file away all your work and notes for your topics?
- 11. Have you been working on study notes each time you finish a topic for a subject?
- 12. Do you have a term planner above your desk where you can easily see when work is due?
- 13. Have you set up a good study environment at home, a place where you can focus and work?
- 14. Are you doing around an hour and a half of schoolwork most nights (2-3 hrs for seniors)?
- 15. Have you thought realistically about whether you have too many outside school activities?
- 16. Have you allocated set periods of time for school work (eg at least 3 x half hour blocks)?
- 17. Do you remove all distractions etc. when you are focusing on your schoolwork at home?
- 18. Do you prioritise each afternoon what you will work on that night?
- 19. When you make study notes, are you making them visual with mind maps, highlighting etc?
- 20. When you study for a test, do you both 'learn' the content and 'practise' the skills?
- 21. Do you try to do lots of the practise under examination conditions?
- 22. Have you reviewed the different study techniques that you should use for your learning preferences?
- 23. Are you doing more than 'just reading' when you study for an assessment?
- 24. Have you thought about how you will overcome the obstacles you face in achieving your best?
- 25. Have you set up some routines to try and create habits that will help you this year?

Kiss N Go Zones need cooporation to ensure the safety of all children.


ACC String Ensemble Music Evening

Kids Do Well If They Can!

Collaborative Proactive Soloutions (CPS) is the work of psychologist and author, Dr Ross W Greene. Dr Greene's evidence-based approach is centred on solving the problems that cause behaviour, not merely modifying behaviour. He believes that if we understand why and when a child is behaving in a certain way, we can help them problem-solve in a collaborative and proactive way to find a solution that meets both the needs of the child and those who have a behaviour expectation the child is required to meet (usually teachers, parents or peers).

Dr Greene bases his work on five key paradigm shifts, one of these being "Kids do well if they can." This contrasts with behaviour modification techniques that use rewards. Such techniques presume that the child has a motivational issue. Dr Greene's research discovered that for most children motivation isn't the issue underlying their challenging behaviour, but in fact the issue is a lack of skills to consistently meet the required behaviour expectations in a variety of situations. The behaviour that doesn't meet expectations is seen as a signal that there is an underlying problem.

Working together, adults help children to identify these underlying problems using an "ask the kid" approach. e.g. "I notice you are finding it tricky to focus on your book during silent reading time. What's up?" Working together, the child then develops skills as they negotiate win-win solutions.

The Wellbeing and Learning Support teams at ACC have been learning about the CPS approach so that we can support students to solve problems and develop skills that will enable them, over time, to meet behaviour expectations. We want to be in a space where we are working proactively so children don't need to signal to us that they need help through adaptive behaviours, rather than waiting for the behaviours to occur and then reacting to them in a way that never gets around to identifying and addressing the underlying problems.
