On Wednesday we conducted the interviews for Student Council Executive positions for 2026. These positions are announced at our Celebration and Awards Evening on the 12th November.

Assessment Policy and Holidays during Term Time

As the end of year starts to approach, some families may be tempted to go on holidays early. I remind parents and students that holidays taken during school term time is not a valid reason for extensions or non-submission of assessment, and could have serious implications on student's grade. This is particularly the case for senior studies where are bound by the QCAA's regulations and procedures around assessment which includes:

"All AARA (Access Arrangements and Reasonable Adjustments) applications must be accompanied by the relevant supporting documentation (outlined in Section 6.5.1) and made as far in advance as possible to meet the QCAA published timelines.

Students are not eligible for AARA on the following grounds:

- unfamiliarity with the English language
- teacher absence or other teacher-related issues
- matters that the student could have avoided
- matters of the student's or parent's/carer's own choosing (eg. holidays, participation in sporting teams)
- matters that the school could have avoided.

Students and parents/carers must contact the Head Secondary as soon as possible and submit the relevant supporting documentation. Copies of the medical report template, extension application and other documentation are available from the Secondary Office and the College's website (Student Wellbeing Tab). To make an informed decision about an illness and misadventure application, the QCAA requires a report that includes the following details:

- the illness, condition or event (including details of a diagnosis, where applicable)
- date of diagnosis, onset or occurrence
- symptoms, treatment or course of action related to the condition or event
- explanation of the probable effect of the illness, condition or event on the student's participation in the assessment
- for non-medical claims, written evidence from a relevant independent professional or other independent third party, such as a police report.

Correction on Academic Awards

In the last newsletter I made an error in the information I gave about the new GPA system for determining academic awards. It should read as follows:

Gold Academic Award

To earn a Gold Award for Academic Excellence, students have a grade point average (GPA) equivalent to an A- or higher. For senior students, this is calculated from only General & Applied subjects. For Years 7 & 8, Trimester 3 will not be included in the calculations.

Silver Academic Award

To earn a SilverAward for Academic Excellence, students have a grade point average (GPA) equivalent to an B or higher. For senior students, this is calculated from only General & Applied subjects. For Years 7 & 8, Trimester 3 will not be included in the calculations.

Year 3 Council Visit

Did you know that you cannot recycle batteries, and you should not put electronics in your bin as it might start a fire? This week the Gr 3 classes had a special visit from Miss Amelia who is from the Townsville City Council and she came to talk to us about recycling and rubbish in our city. We are learning all about community and how we can help in HASS this Term.

Firstly, she told us what to and what not to put into your recycling bin. We did a quiz about the correct items in your bin. She also told us about her job. She helps to keep Townsville clean and to educate people. Amelia told us about our TRASH. She told us that the red bin is for general waste, and this goes to landfill. She reminded us that things like dirty nappies and scraps go into the bin with a red lid. This bin gets picked up every week.

Next, she told us all about recycling. She showed us the recycling arrow sign but reminded us that unless it is black then it goes in the rubbish bin not recycling. Soft plastics aren't able to be recycled yet. She also told us that we should never put batteries or electronics in the bin, because it could start a fire. Then, she told us about what materials items are made from. We found out that bottles come from sand and that plastic are made from oil.

Finally, we watched a video about how our recycling is sorted at the Townsville facility and what happens to it. We saw the process from start to finish. It was very interesting. In our class, we talked about better changes we could all make at school and at home. We need to encourage people to put things in the right bin. We now have a magnet to put on our fridge to remind us what to recycle and what not to recycle. Can you join me in doing the right thing and putting the rubbish in the right bin. We don't want Townsville to become Trashville!
