## JUBILEE YEAR of *Mercy*



One of our major goals at St Patrick's College this year has been to unite our girls through music, by the introduction of a whole school choir. Research indicates that music-making creates a strong sense of well-being and is suggested to improve physical and mental health. There are also the benefits of promoting social bonding, school spirit and pride. The physiological benefits of singing, and music more generally, have long been explored. Music-making exercises the brain as well as the body, but singing is particularly beneficial for improving breathing, posture and muscle tension. Singing is one of the most accessible forms of music; everyone can sing! You only need to attend one of our whole school rehearsals to see our girls are more positive and happier after singing. There is an obvious joy in connecting with one another which importantly strengthens their sense of belonging.

Along with the whole school choir, this year has seen the creation of the Liturgy Choir. Recently they have performed at the Mercy Pilgrimage which saw us walk our way from one Townsville Mercy Ministry to another, taking us from the Mater Hospital, to Loreto Nursing Home, on to Villa McAuley and finishing at the St Patrick's College Convent and Chapel. Thanks to Father Mick Peters for leading us in prayer on this occasion.

Recently I had the pleasure of attending Mass and a luncheon with the St Patrick's College, Past Pupils, Brisbane Branch at St Stephen's Cathedral in Brisbane. President, Janice Doyle was a welcoming host and provided me with the opportunity to share recent College developments with the group. They regaled me with wonderful memories of their time at the College – for some that was more than 60 years ago. It was just lovely to hear of the school's rich traditions.

This weekend we will take a trip down memory lane as our girls participate in the T150 Townville Pacific Festival Parade. Our girls will show off our proud history as they don uniforms worn by St Patrick's College girls over the last 100 years.

### EXAM PREPARATION

With Exam Block upon us, it would seem timely to revise the tried and tested exam preparation tips. For parent/guardians, aiming to provide a quiet, calm environment at home for the week will help your daughter immensely as she prepares for exams. Some tried and tested last minute exam tips are suggested below:

#### *This Weekend:*

- Maintain a positive environment: Keep a positive attitude and believe in yourself. Listen to teachers and ask questions. Focus on passing your exams and seeing a successful outcome.
- Make a study plan: Spend some time planning what you are going to study and when you are going to study. Post it up at home so everyone can see it.

#### *The night before:*

- Revise your notes quietly and quickly. Cramming the night before does NOT work as your brain gets too 'full' and is unable to recall lots of information at once. It is more important to get a really good night's sleep and be fresh and relaxed for the exam.

#### *The morning of the exam:*

- Have a good protein-rich breakfast and eat food that will sustain you, not junk food. Research has proven by simply eating a good breakfast exam scores can be improved significantly.

#### *It's Exam time:*

- Stay positive and relaxed.
- Scan the paper before you start writing and start with an easy question first. You do not have to do all the questions in order. Read the questions carefully and make sure you are answering the question.
- Maintain a good sitting posture in the exam - slouching will slow blood flow to your brain and possibly affect your performance.
- Manage your time: Pace yourself and keep an eye on the time. With 5 minutes remaining you should be checking to ensure you have answered as much as possible and making final notes.
- Neatness counts: It is important to write as clearly as you can. Make sure numbers are easy to read and you avoid too much scribbling out of errors.
- I'm done: It is vitally important, as mentioned previously, that you go back and check your work. Check your spelling and check that you have answered all the questions you can.

## PASTORAL CARE

There are many aspects of life at St Patrick's College that are not necessarily academic, but are still significantly important to the development of your daughters' social, emotional and physical growth.

We take our responsibility of providing safe, secure and valuable learning opportunities and experiences outside of the regular academic classroom, extremely seriously. There is significant research to support the value of Outdoor Education Programs in regard to the development of student relationships, working together towards a common goal, strategic planning and thinking and the recognition of the unique attributes that each individual has to bring to the group.

Outdoor education programs are designed to help students recognise that risk can be dealt with responsibly and with thought; lessons that are highly applicable to any young persons' personal life. Such experiences are always followed up by guided reflection that helps determine how a situation might be approached again. Thus, a vital element of the experience is the transfer of learning into everyday contexts. On the most basic level, Outdoor Education experiences provides simple physical exercise in a beautiful environment, healthy living and an opportunity for staff and students to interact and build strong relationships on neutral ground, away from the normal classroom environment.

Two weeks ago, our Year 8 students experienced all of the above amongst the beautiful surrounds of Lake Tinnaroo. Please follow the link to view a snapshot of the girls' experiences.

On Tuesday 14 June, our Year 7 girls, along with Year 7 students from St Margaret Mary's College and Ignatius Park College, will come together for a Community Pastoral Day, held on and around the beautiful Strand Park. ## MERCY GIRLS IN ACTION

Recently our group has been discussing the issue of homelessness within our community. The term homeless is often used to describe people who are sleeping on the street, however homelessness affects more people than we could ever imagine. The term homeless is defined as living in non-conventional accommodation as well as those who are living in short term or emergency accommodation. This includes people sleeping in cars and in parks, as well as people who constantly move from house to house with no permanent address.


